From North:

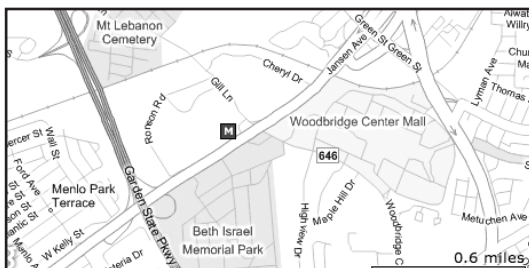
